SPRING – Refresh & Inspect

Spring is about recovery and preparation. After winter and early storms, this is the time to check, clean, and reset.

- Inspect your roof and gutters
 - Look for missing shingles, debris, or signs of leaks after winter weather.
- Clean out gutters and downspouts
 - Proper drainage helps prevent water damage and foundation issues.
- Check exterior siding and paint
 - Look for peeling, cracking, or mildew caused by moisture.
- Service your HVAC system
 - Before the Alabama heat sets in, ensure your system is ready to operate efficiently.
- Check windows and doors
 - Look for worn caulking or seals that allow air and moisture to enter.
- Test smoke detectors
 - Replace batteries and confirm everything is working properly.

SUMMER – Protect & Maintain

- Monitor your air conditioning performance
 - Listen for unusual noises and note uneven cooling.
- Change HVAC filters regularly
 - This helps with air quality and keeps systems running smoothly.
- Watch for moisture and mildew
 - Bathrooms, laundry rooms, and closets are common trouble spots.
- Inspect outdoor plumbing and irrigation
 - Look for leaks or pooling water near the foundation.
- Check attic ventilation
 - Proper airflow helps control heat and moisture buildup.
- Trim vegetation away from the home
 - This improves airflow and reduces pest access.

FALL – Prepare & Prevent

Fall is about getting ahead of colder weather and year-end storms.

- Clean gutters again
Falling leaves can quickly cause clogs.
- Inspect the roof before winter
Fixing small issues now prevents bigger problems later.
- Seal gaps around doors and windows
This improves comfort and energy efficiency.
- Service heating components
Make sure everything is ready before temperatures drop.
- Drain and store outdoor hoses
This helps prevent freezing and pipe damage.
- Check exterior lighting
Shorter days mean lighting matters more for safety.

WINTER – Monitor & Protect

Alabama winters are usually mild, but cold snaps can still cause damage if ignored.

- Protect exposed pipes
Insulate pipes in crawl spaces and exterior walls.
- Monitor indoor humidity levels
Too much moisture can lead to mold and wood damage.
- Check for drafts and leaks
Address issues before they worsen.
- Test carbon monoxide detectors
Especially important when using heating systems.
- Inspect crawl spaces and basements
Look for moisture, standing water, or unusual odors.
- Stay alert during freezes
Let faucets drip and open cabinet doors when temperatures drop significantly.
