# What “First-Time Buyer,” Really Means in Alabama

This matters because many savings and assistance programs are based on this definition. Too many buyers disqualify themselves before ever asking. If you’re unsure, it’s always worth checking. You may be more eligible than you think.



# The Alabama Housing Finance Authority (AHFA)

The Alabama Housing Finance Authority is the primary organization offering first-time buyer assistance in our state. Their programs are designed to make homeownership more accessible, especially for buyers who have steady income but limited savings.

## The most common programs include:

### First Step & Step Up

These are traditional mortgage programs with more flexible guidelines than many standard loans.

They often allow:

- Lower down payments
- Competitive interest rates
- Reduced upfront cash requirements

### First Step Plus & Step Up Plus

These programs include down payment assistance, usually in the form of a second loan that helps cover part of your down payment and closing costs.

Important things to understand:

- The assistance is not always “free money”
- Some programs require repayment if you sell or refinance early
- The trade-off is often a slightly higher interest rate

The goal is not to get you into the cheapest loan on paper.

The goal is to get you into a home without draining every dollar you have.



# Down Payment Assistance: What's Realistic

Down payment assistance is one of the most misunderstood parts of buying a home.

In most cases, realistic assistance in Alabama looks like:

- 3% to 4% of the purchase price
- Provided as a grant or second loan
- Tied to income and credit guidelines

Here's what buyers need to know:

- Assistance often comes with conditions
- Some funds must be repaid if you sell too soon
- You may accept a slightly higher interest rate
- You still need some money of your own

Down payment help is a tool.

Not a shortcut.

And not something to use blindly.

Used wisely, it helps you buy sooner without financial strain.

Used poorly, it can limit your flexibility later.



# The Alabama First-Time Buyer Savings Account

This is one of the most powerful tools available for future buyers. Alabama allows individuals and families to open a special savings account specifically for first-time home purchases.

These accounts can offer:

- State tax benefits
- Long-term savings growth

- Anyone planning 1–3 years ahead
